



As always, we warmly appreciate the loyal and consistent support of our friends in the trade.


May the high quality of the sheets in the frames give pleasure to many and may all who are beginners learn much from the skill and expertise of the more advanced exhibitors.

The trophy is competed for annually between societies affiliated to the Hampshire Philatelic Federation.

Each society's entry consists of exhibits from two of its members, each member submitting nine album sheets.

For judging, entries are divided into three categories: general, postal history, and thematic.

The Judges are appointed by the Council of the Federation, and the trophy is awarded to the Society whose entry gains the highest marks.

Marking in general and postal history sections is given for philatelic knowledge and personal study, importance, condition and presentation. In thematic, marking is given for presentation, theme, philatelic knowledge, and condition.

An individual trophy is awarded to the exhibitor who gains the highest marks.




