BASINGSTOKE and DISTRICT PHILATELIC SOCIETY NEWSLETTER July 2016...



On June 20th our visiting speaker was Mr John Armstone and his subject was "These are a few of my favourite things" - no resemblance to the music from the "Sound Of Music". John had previously visited the Society in July 2015 when he spoke on "From Post Horse to Post Bus". He divided the evening on Cinderella's into two parts namely

A World Tour and the British Isles. In the World Tour John covered Australia (1850 Gold Rush), New Zealand (Trade Exhibitions), USA (Wells Fargo), Africa, New Hebrides, British Solomon Isles and Europe. The British Isles featured the Isle of Wight, Revenue Stamps, Local Authorities, Individual Carriers, Norwich Union and the 1981 Postal Strike. The point I raised with John was that there must have been a very fine line in the British Isles between the Government's official postage and the utilisation of Cinderella's. He agreed that the fine line was crossed and various establishments were frequently brought to order.

On July 4th our visiting speaker was Mr John Tingey and his subject was "The Englishman who posted himself". A fascinating evening which began with a projector / computer show on Mail Art - a subject in it's own right. It featured a variety of fascinating designs on envelopes - with strong resemblance to the Victorian Mulready Envelopes. We were then introduced to Mr W. Reginald Bray (1879 - 1939) an accountant living in the Forest Hill area of London. His passion was sending unusual items through the mail. In 1898 he purchased the Post Office Guide and studied their regulations. John traced the Bray Family Tree and utilised that information to identify items posted by relations on his behalf. He posted all manner of items (large and small) through the mail challenging the authorities as to whether the items were legal or otherwise. He always insured that the correct postage was affixed. There then followed a section on Bray's autograph fascination and the methodology in how he obtained them.

YOUR FEDERATION NEEDS YOUR HELP...





Five philatelists associated with Hampshire societies exhibited at the New York 2016 World Stamp Show held for 8 days at the Javits Center in New York City in early June.

Wendy Buckle was awarded a vermeil for her 5 frame exhibit "Paper Past and Present". Robin Pizer gained a large vermeil for his 5 frames of "Belgian, British and American Restrictions on Civil Mail in the Rhineland 1918-1925". Derrick Pillage also gained a large vermeil for his 5 frames of "The French Influence on Airmail Development in South America". Peter Weir gained gold for his 8 frame showing of "Liquid of Life-Blood, from an Ancient Myth to a Modern Medicine". Lesley Marley was awarded a large gold for her 8 frame exhibit "A Whale's Tale". Congratulations to all for their medals and for their hard work in preparing and exhibiting material from their collections.

In all there were over 4000 frames of exhibits in a huge hall the size of a football field, not to mention the dealer and society stands in an

equally large space, and meeting and auction rooms in a lower level. It was a great venue for a large, well organised and attended show.

During the event an outstanding example of the USA 24¢ "inverted Jenny" stamp sold for \$1,351,250 (including 15% commission) at an auction held by R A Siegel Auction Gallery. The auctioneer, Scott Trepel, had a replica Curtis Jenny bi-plane brought down from Rheinbeck aerodrome in upstate New York to the Javits Center, where it stood in pride of place in the entrance hall of this recently rebuilt gigantic, modern glass and steel structure.

This visitor to New York noted that his hotel bill included a \$3.30 Javits Center Fee for each day of his stay as a contribution to the rebuild cost!

However, he was pleased to have his picture taken alongside the famous aeroplane!





Meeting: 10th May, 2016...

'One Page Competition – Members only'...

This completion saw just seven entries, but quality and interest were much in evidence. The event required members themselves to do the voting, but as in the rules, they were not allowed to self-vote!! Subjects ranged from general themes, as in the case of 'Bridges over the Grand Canal', featuring in particular the 'Ponte di Rialto', to highly technical - 'Various Positions of dots in the Maltese Cross Cancellation', a study of aspects of postmarks on GB Victorian penny-red stamps. An historically challenging subject 'Deplored Explorer -Capt. James Cook (1728-1779)' gave rise to considerations of the damaging effects of European culture and health issues on native populations. A fascinating display looked at 'Postmen with Transport -Various Types of Boat'. Here were included stamps depicting a Solomon Islands' cruise launch, Equatorial Guinea's canoes, a galley used by the Indonesian Republic and a Falkland Islands' schooner...and numerous others. Some stamps are rare/scarce because of printing inaccuracies resulting in official stock recall. An example was available



within the competition, that of 'The recalled UNESCO Dinosaur Provincial Park Stamp, Canada 2015. Such a stamp was exhibited alongside the re-printed, reinstated example. 'The 150th Penny Black Anniversary' and a postal service where mail coaches, camel post and a Russian courier from the Middle Ages were presented.

The final entry and overall winner was member Paul Barry's 'New Acquisitions—GB Queen Victoria 1887 Jubilee Issue', who was awarded the 'President's Cup' by the Society's Chairman Colin Mount. This entry included 1/- green stamps, the 6d. purple/rose on a Wareham parcel-post label

and a beautiful advertising envelope promoting the talents and services of a German art design company operating in the latter part of the 19th Century. The competition was much enhanced by a range of supporting material... stamps mint and used, mini-sheets, covers, photos, drawings, maps, good write-ups and quality presentation. The meeting concluded with an enjoyable 'Bring and Buy' session.

Meetings are at Greyfriars on most second Tuesdays in the month. An all-day Stamp Fair...'RINGPEX' is planned for Saturday, 3rd June 2017... free entry and all most welcome.

My latest Postal History acquisition is displayed below. This is a Soldier's 1d Concessionary Rate letter, from Winchester. These are not easy to find nowadays.



The design for the Concessionary Rate address side is drawn up in accordance with the laws of the post office. Within the narrow space at the top for the sender's name, rank number and Regiment. The space at the left side is for the signature of the approving officer. The larger space at the right hand side is for the name and address as to where it is to be sent.

This letter is from Private Geo' Sperring No. 755 – 23 Reg't 4 Royal Welch Fusiliers countersigned by N Harrison, Lt Col Commanding 23 Reg't RWF and sent to Con'l. Tho' Aspinwall, Consol to the United States, London. *P1* in red for postage

with a red double rim tombstone E/PAID/18MY18/1835 on the back is a black cds for WINCHESTER/MY16/1835.

The letter reads: "Winchester May 14th 1835...

To Con'l Tho.s Aspinwall,

Sir, I Received Your Letter of the 26 of April last and was happy to receive the acknowledgement of the Money Received by you for my Discharge, which will become due on the 23rd of May according to your

'Dorset Postal History' - Bill Pipe..

Although, as Chairman Colin Mount stated in his opening welcome, 'we all know Bill Pipe', his subject 'Dorset Postal History' proved to be somewhat obscure. Postal history emanating from such a rural county from the period 1606 through to the Victorian era (and beyond) was bound to be affected. Bill referred to 'a fairly illiterate county of sea farers and labourers'. Trade was centred mainly on Poole and Weymouth, with Bridport, Lyme, Blandford, Shaftesbury and Sherborne playing smaller roles. The earliest cover presented, was coach sent being dated 23rd June, 1606 -Winterbourne to Baynards Castle (Surrey). Early letters were in the display, one written 4 months after Cromwell's death. The earliest postmark presented was 1726. There was a predominance of naval and agricultural mail. The majority of postal gems were from 1840 onwards. A lovely orange Maltese cross cancel (Corfe Castle) on a penny black was enjoyed, together with a cover to London bearing a superb strip of 4 penny blacks -plate 4 AI to AL -the entire having 4 red Maltese cross obliterators, dated 16-10-40, Poole. Other penny blacks followed together with an abundance of two-penny blues and penny reds and numerous later issues, many with interesting cancels registered, late-use, numeral, thimble, cds and inspector cancels. One cover catching the eye was bound for 'Marnhall', (Marnhull) being cancelled 'Blandford' -Ap. 4. 59 with code letter 'C'. The second half of Bill's presentation was equally rewarding. Here there were early ship mail, Mulreadys, railway cancels (a love of Bill's), Dorset Regiment, wreck and strike post mail. Of particular note was a superb unique Victorian Twynham (the dead village thanks to the Military) parcel post label, (find another one!!) The riveting evening drew to an end when Publicity Officer Paul Barry was called upon to provide the vote of thanks. He paid great tribute to this 'Aladdin's cave of treasure with all its rich variety and rarity'. In concluding, he highlighted a selection of the wonderful rural Dorset post office names which had featured, such as Blandford St Mary, Hinton Martell, Long Bredy, Marnhull, Nottington and Punchnoll.

Meetings are held on the first Monday every month at Petersfield Community Centre, at 7.30 p.m. Visitors are welcome.



Basingstoke Society 80th Anniversary Presentation Pack...



The Basingstoke and District Philatelic Society was founded in 1935 and, in 2015, to mark its 80th Anniversary, a special presentation pack was produced. This contains an unmounted mint set of the Great Britain 1935 Silver Jubilee issue as a limited edition of 300. This set was chosen as, along with the various Commonwealth issues, it is believed to have been the catalyst that led to the formation of the Society.

The pack is in the standard Royal Mail format with its folded card outlining the Society as well as a brief history of the ancient market town of Basingstoke. The banner on the pack is a pleasing view of the Basingstoke skyline taken from a hill to the south of the town.
