

The next **Yearbook** is overdue and we would be most grateful if you could let us know now rather than when the update has been published. Come on, help put a little back into this great hobby of ours. If you can help please contact the Bulletin Editor or the Chairman.

And remember your Federation really does need your help.....

The Society has had several venues over the years but currently meets at the HEDCA facilities in Coombe Road, Gosport. A few years ago the Society recognised that many members, and potential members, collected postcards so a proposal to change the name of the society was tabled, discussed and passed. The club is now known as the 'Gosport Stamp & Postcard Society'. Some new members have been welcomed over recent years and a similar warm welcome awaits any potential new members. Visitors are welcome at any time.

Hayling Island Philatelic Society was founded in 1952, just three weeks after the Queen's accession. Like Her Majesty, it continues to be in robust health having served philatelists on the island and adjacent mainland for 67 years (and counting...) It is one of only a handful of "offshore" stamp societies in the UK! Meetings are held on the evening of the second Friday of each month, with no breaks, in the Small Hall of the United Reform Church, Hollow Lane, Mengham, Hayling Island. This very comfortable venue provides the enthusiastic membership with a varied programme of presentations by visiting philatelists; members' meetings; competitions; an annual auction and a Christmas social. The society was renamed "Hayling Island Stamp Club" a few years ago to widen its appeal.

Southampton & District Philatelic Society came into life in 1932 with a preliminary meeting at Lowman's Café, Above Bar. By 1934 membership was 55 and a junior branch had been established. But in 1941 the club closed due to the war. During the war all the records from inception to date were destroyed throw the bombing of Southampton. In 1946, the society was re-born. In 1947 the Society was asked by the B.PA. to display at the British Philatelic Exhibition in London and they provided 3 frames. In 1948 the society magazine Postmark was issued in the Summer and still goes on today. In 1951, Southampton's first public postal history and stamp exhibition was held. The 34th Philatelic Congress of Great Britain was held in Southampton from the 20th May to the 24th 1952. By the end of 1953, the society membership stood at a health number of 162. In 1961, the society hosted the 1961 BPA Convention on the 21st October (Trafalgar Day) at the Royal Hotel. By 1969 the membership stood at 250. In 1973 the Society became a member of the Federation. 1982 saw the society hosting the 64th British Philatelic Federation Congress (formerly the Philatelic Congress of Great Britain) between the 20th & 24th 1982. In 1984 the society membership had grown to 315 paid up members but in 1986 this had dropped to 250. In 1992 the society marked its Diamond Jubilee with a number of events and special covers. Then 1993 the first HAMPEX was held in Ringwood. To round up the society history, 2007 saw the Jubilee of

HAMPEX JUDGE RECIEVES TOP US PHILATELIC HONOUR...



A COVER FROM 50 YEARS AGO...

Given the Federation's 50th birthday I felt sure I could find a cover from 1969. Better still, one addressed to Hampshire (sadly, none postmarked in Hampshire).



This registered airmail letter was postmarked on the back (to force US postal clerks to turn the cover over to ensure that it was securely sealed). That requires the adhesives to be cancelled with the dumb oval handstamp shown. Posted on 20th October 1969 in Washington, DC, the two 50¢ plus one 40¢ stamps pay the 80¢ registration fee and triple rate airmail (3x 20¢ per ½0z). The 80¢ registration fee had only just been introduced on 1st July 1969, while the airmail rate had started on 1st May 1967. The stamps themselves are of note, commemorating two outstanding figures in United States history.

The 40¢ stamp commemorates Thomas Paine who is probably well known to many readers. Thomas Paine (February 9, 1737 – June 8, 1809) was an English-born American political activist, philosopher, political theorist, and revolutionary. One of the Founding Fathers of the United States, he authored the two most influential pamphlets at the start of the American Revolution and inspired the patriots in 1776 to declare independence from Britain. Later he supported the revolution in 1790's France.

Perhaps less well known, but also very topical for 2019, is Lucy Stone, remembered on the 50¢ stamp. Lucy Stone (August 13, 1818 – October 18, 1893) was a prominent U.S. orator, abolitionist, and suffragist, and a vocal advocate and organizer promoting rights for

150 ISSUES LATER...

The Chichester and District Philatelic Society was begun Monday 9th February 1959 at the Assembly Rooms in Chichester. Chair was taken by Mr E.W. wild goose (President ASPS), aided by Mr R.C.Emery and Mr L.W.Wildgoose (secretary of ASPS). In the March 1959 meeting Mr G. Hinton and Mr E. A.Wells were elected as a committee of two with Major H.T. Simmonds as Secretary. By the end of that meeting seven had joined the society. Mr Farley Smith, Mr Emery, Mr Gilbert, Mrs Hinton, Mr Simmonds, Mr Wells, and Mr Wildgoose. After a letter had been sent out to about seventy people, with reports in the numerous newspapers in the area, not only the membership increased, but the committee members did too! First President was Brigadier G.A.Viner OBE. The first AGM was held in May 1959 with 29 members attending. The rules of the society were adapted then and subs were 10 shillings! It was then that the society also joined the Association of Sussex Philatelic Societies.

Note that many of our trophies and competition plates are named after early members: Viner, Simmonds, Symes, Allam, Birmingham and Peal.

It is my privilege as President to celebrate this 60th Anniversary with our society but also to share this brief history with you.

Martha Brown President Chichester and District Philatelic Society..

Farnborough Stamp and Postcard Club was formed in 1964 as The Royal Aircraft Establishment Philatelic Society. This officially folded in 1990, but some of the members decided to form the Farnborough Stamp Club which was founded in 1991. This was later renamed Farnborough Stamp and Postcard Club and is still a thriving club.

Fleet and North Hants Philatelic Society has provided a forum for stamp collectors in the Fleet area since it was founded in 1946. Local collectors started the society as Fleet and District Stamp Club, following a successful stamp exhibition in a local gymnasium. In 1953, the society changed the name to Fleet and North Hants Philatelic Society to cater for more serious philatelic interests.

Gosport, a small friendly but active club, founded in April 1976, meeting on the second Tuesday of the each month, starting 7.30 pm.

women. In 1847, Stone became the first woman from Massachusetts to earn a college degree. She spoke out for women's rights and against slavery at a time when women were discouraged and prevented from public speaking. Stone was known for using her birth name after marriage, the custom being for women to take their husband's surname.

Just so you know, my other 1969 cover to Hampshire, addressed to Ferndown, is a single-rate airmail cover at the earlier 75ϕ registration fee. It also bears stamps featuring Lucy Stone and Thomas Paine, but this time alongside George Washington (5ϕ) .

WINCHESTER POSTAL HISTORY REFERENCE COLLECTION – NOW ONLINE...

The extensive reference collection assembled by the Winchester and District Stamp Society was offered as a gift to the Hampshire Record Office where it is available to anyone wishing to consult it at the address given at the foot of this article. The Hampshire Federation is pleased to have been given access to scans of the collection's pages in order to upload them to view on the Federation's website.

The collection's introductory page may be accessed via this web address:

The collection consists of some 256 items mounted on numbered sheets which may be browsed in order. The collection has also been arranged in sections. These may be accessed by the links provided in the introductory page.

Note that each page was scanned with high definition and is therefore large to download and it is recommended that you view the collection using a broad band connection.

Most of the sheets are scanned at 800 dpi and the text of some letters which may be of interest to postal or local historians has also been scanned. It should be noted that there is a gap in the archive: sheet numbers 72 to 99 are missing and these were apparently 'lost' from the archive a number of years ago. The reference collection was scanned and made available by Roger Harris.

Ashley Lawrence, Fellow of the Royal Philatelic Society London recently provided the Club with a superb opportunity to study very fine and unique material, supported by a considerable wealth of historical input. Setting the context within the early part of the 20th century in particular, Ashley provided a wealth of background history surrounding the period of huge Turkish expansionism and subsequent decline. With the ending of First World War hostilities, the League of Nations set up a system of mandates, whereby Britain and France were authorised to administer various territories. With sudden decline of Turkish superpower influence

in the Middle East at that time, such mandates were vital and provided some stability, aided by the establishment of post offices, which in turn gave momentum to trading links. The study of stamps and overprints for this period has been much complicated by changing boundaries and currencies, and this superb philatelic display, enjoyed by Club Members, underlined both the sheer variety of material and its scarcity. Besides the provision of substantial historical information, maps, correspondence and photographs, the display was rich in stamps both mint and used, covers, postcards and of course overprints, this last being of huge significance within the shared material. This memorable presentation revealed a vast and complex area of study for the philatelic specialist, superbly written-up, and gave Club a glimpse of most interesting, unusual and indeed rare material. The breaks in presentation offered opportunities for close scrutiny of exhibits and for much appreciated informal chats with Ashley, who was delighted to further share, discuss and promote this seldom seen area of philatelic study and endeavour.
