The presentation subject of 'Anniversaries & Jubilees' proved a good choice by Programme Secretary Hugh Jefferies, with five members taking part. Paul Lear commenced batting with a colourful display and fascinating commentary promoting philatelic 'Botswana' over some 50 years. Of items, worthy of notice was a 1971 cover celebrating the country's 5th Anniversary of independence. This input was followed by Hugh Jefferies with his highly interesting KGV 1935 Jubilee 'Windsor Castle' display, which was highly detailed, covering printers, printings, plates, perforations and numerous varieties, including on cover. Told in Hugh's unique, well informed and engaging style, this popular omnibus issue was certainly well covered and well received. Phil Olds contributed a display covering a less known philatelic area ...'Travencore', where sheets, watermarks and 1921 surcharges were to the fore. Of note was the lovely set celebrating...'The Investiture of the Maharaja'. FORDS THE MOTOR COMPANY.

Being the Postal Historian and Archivist there is a mass of material that you the member will never see. This sparked my interest as my father had a connection with the Ford Transit factory at Swaythling as he worked in the paint shop spraying the vans (Long before robots!!!!).



The plant, on a 44-acre $(180,000m^2)$ site near Southampton Airport, was built as a shadow factory to assemble aircraft components for engineering firm Cunliffe -Owen Aircraft, and was opened by the Mayor of Southampton on 2nd February 1939. At the

outbreak of World War II, the factory and its supply chain were switched to produce parts for the Supermarine Spitfire. Recognised as an important part of the British war effort, it was bombed on a number of occasions by the German Luftwaffe, the first in September 1940. In the later years of the war, the site was used to assemble the Spitfire. It was the western European centre for production of the Ford Transit van.






In September 2011, Ford of Europe confirmed that Southampton would continue to make the short and medium wheelbase, and Tourneo minibus versions, of the Transit for two more years. Production of these was then to be consolidated to Turkey with the new model in 2014, while Southampton was to continue as the European centre for the chassis-cab variant of the new Transit, with production ramped up to 35,000 units a year.

On 26 October 2012, Ford announced that, as part of a larger cutback of their European production capacity, the Southampton factory would close altogether in July 2013, with production for Europe of all the new Transit models shifted to Turkey. The Dagenham Stamping Plant was also to be shut down; this plant had provided most of the sheet metal panels for the Southampton Assembly Plant. The last Transit went into production on 15 July 2013 and was completed on 26 July.

RINGWOOD PHILATELIC SOCIETY. Meeting 13th July, 2021. **'The Western Desert Campaign 1940-43'** Gavin Fryer FRPSL.



Following a lengthy period of lockdown, Ringwood Philatelic Society was very pleased to re-convene with Gavin Fryer's engaging presentation - 'The Western Desert Campaign 1940-43'. This was a rich historical philatelic journey into a major and pivotal part of the war. It was superbly supported by maps, newspaper cuttings, stamps, original covers and letters, telegrams, censored mail, Christmas cards, detailed information sheets and fine exposition. Over many years, Gavin had made an in-depth study of this subject and his knowledge was most impressive. His presentation followed a strict chronology, commencing with April 1940 when Sir Henry Maitland Wilson, Commander of British troops in Egypt, formed the Western Desert Force. There began a period in which Allied and Axis forces were at war in huge numbers involving many nations. Gavin considered the conflict from both sides, covering key decisions, commanders and command and the essential focus on supply. Operations, offensives, seiges and retreats were all looked at. A closer examination of major personalities was engaged, such as Rommel and Montgomery. A major emphasis dealt with the concluding episodes of the conflict, which finally saw nearly 240,000 German and Italian soldiers captured, with Alexander's signal to Churchill stating 'The Tunisian Campaign is over...we are masters of the North African shores'. The vital supply of oil to progress the European war had been achieved.

Underpinned by rich military and historical content, this quality of presentation was exceptional and much appreciated by RPS Members...an excellent start to the Society's emerging programme.

THE ROYAL PHILATELIC SOCIETY PRESS RELEASE.

Third time lucky

Richard Stock FRPSL has faced a most unusual period as President of the Royal Philatelic Society London, unlike that of any of his predecessors. Elected in June 2019 for a two-year term, he was able to chair only a handful of 'face-to-face' meetings, having quickly to adapt to the new world of Zoom and YouTube displays. Having assembled a fine selection of displays for the two years, sadly most could not be enjoyed 'in the flesh'.

It was therefore with much pleasure – and probably relief – that he took the Chair once again on 9 September to introduce a truly remarkable display from Malcolm Ray-Smith FRPSL. It was the 'third time of asking' as two previous attempts at having the presentation had to be aborted. It was enjoyed not only by members but also by many guests from the City of London, representing the livery companies, museums and libraries.

Malcolm's display focused on The Royal Mail 1516 to 1766. The two dates marked significant landmarks in the development of the postal service. It is thought 1516 is the year when Brian Tuke was first called by the title of Master of the Posts. It was in 1766 that Ralph Allen died: in 1713 he had become postmaster at Bath before being appointed Master of the Bye and Cross Posts in 1720. In that role he was responsible for improving the provincial posts all over England, effectively creating the public postal service we know today.

All were astounded by what they saw, remarkable letters tracing events over the 250 years, not least the role played by the English Civil Wars. Richard Stock described the presentation as 'outstanding, magnificent and comprehensive', views echoed by Simon Richards FRPSL, a Vice-President of the Society giving the Vote of Thanks, who spoke of an 'extraordinary in-depth and amazing display, beautifully presented'.

ROYAL PHILATELIC SOCIETY, LONDON.
