EDITORIAL...

As I am putting the bulletin together things are starting up again with clubs appearing to have meetings up and running, Packet circuits going around and Auctions keeping clubs solvent along with clubs/ societies memberships appear to be levelling off. I do not think many clubs/societies are in a worse position than the start of COVID 2yrs ago and are starting to get back to some kind of normality (If there is such a word anymore). The thing I have noted is that clubs are having trouble filling committee vacancies and struggling to get a new committee members.

The problem is two fold... An aging membership who do not or are unable to use computers and its software and also members that have to hold 2 or 3 committee positions just to keep clubs/societies going but this has its drawbacks if that person decides to leave the club/ society for what ever reason or illness, then you could have 3 vacancies to fill. So when a committee position comes available it is very difficulty to fill them without twisting arms (Not advisable as this can hurt!!!). How do we get round these issues? You have to think of reducing what you can offer your members BUT some posts you must have such as Chairman, Treasurer, Secretary & Editor. Magazines keep members informed as not all have access to the Internet and many members enjoy the noise when their magazine drops through onto the carpet and keeps them informed of their clubs activities. If you reduce what you can offer, then this will affect membership as this will drop away and you will not be able to attract new members.

This is a problem that ALL Federation and all stamp clubs around the world have to resolve and unfortunately we have in the past seen clubs/societies close because they could not fill committee positions.

The Federation has to say goodbye to another member - Hampshire Postal History Society (See Page 18) that as above has had to close. The Federation now consists of 16 clubs/societies but is still in a good place to promote Stamp collecting amongst its members.

THATCHAM SUCCESS AT THE THAMES VALLEY FEDERATION 9-SHEET COMPETITIONS.



HAMPSHIRE PHILATELIC FEDERATION CONVENTIONS OF THE PAST.

I was recently contacted by Neil Jones, no relation, who had the honour and challenge of organising the "11th Annual Convention" in April 1981. He loaned me a copy of the programme together with programmes for the 4th, 6th, 7th and 9th Conventions. As a member of the Wheatsheaf Philatelic Society (open only to IBM employees) and working at IBM Cosham he was able to organise the Convention on the premises at the IBM Havant Plant.

The 1981 catalogue of exhibits ran to 76 frames including entries in the Howard White Trophy competition. In those days each entry was 9 sheets rather than the 16 sheets of current competitions. None the less, that is an impressive quantity of exhibits! Nineteen societies were on the Federation roster, but it is not clear if all submitted entries. The current roster of societies affiliated with the Hampshire Federation is seventeen – many the same as back in 1981. It is also clear that competition entries were judged on exhibition day with the room only open for viewing after judging was completed. (Portsmouth DPS was the winner)!

The first HPF convention was organised in 1970 and the winner of the Howard White Trophy was Vectis who went on to repeat that feat in 1974, 1975, 1978 and 1979! In 1973 thirteen societies are listed with 28 described exhibits and Petersfield exhibited in Town Hall with Petersfield 4^{th} hosting DPS the Convention. In 1976 the Convention was hosted by



Southampton DPS in Eastleigh Town Hall with 34 exhibits and 14 affiliated societies listed. It was the turn of Winchester DPS in 1977 to host the event in the Winchester Guildhall with 39 exhibits and 15 affiliated societies listed. Petersfield DPS again did the honours in 1979 with 34 exhibits and 16 listed societies.

From the above programmes the number of dealers varies in the 11 to 15 range. Although I only became active with the Federation around 1985 I recognise most of the active officers and other philatelists mentioned, but I have to say that I am unfamiliar with many of the names of dealers from that period. Sadly, I fear most are no longer in business. We are thus lucky to have attracted some 20 dealers to recent HPF Conventions hosted by the Federation at Wickham.

For most of the period 1970-80 the HPF President was Frank B. Howard-White, FRPSL, so it is no wonder that the emphasis of the convention was the Howard White inter-society competition. This was strongly supported by judges who were also members of the Royal Philatelic Society London. Today's Hampshire Federation, while running a different style of Convention (HAMPEX), is still strongly supported by judges who are also members of RPSL and dedicated to making competitive philately a reality for local societies.

I hope that we can continue supporting competitive philately into the future with the active participation of our affiliated societies.

Meeting 9th November, 2021.

'Cause, Cure and History of the Plague Pandemics'.

Speaker: Chris Wheeler.



This top quality competitive presentation was sourced and superbly written-up by Chris Wheeler within 10 months!! In Wendy Buckle's vote of thanks, she very accurately voiced the opinion of members present...'a major achievement – immensely impressive'.

This display ... 'Cause, Cure and History the Plague of Pandemics' (topical indeed!!) made significant reference to historical sources, and was well supported by quality early correspondence and excellent historical detail. Philatelic material included excellent examples of notable stamp issues from GB, France, Switzerland. Russia and

China. Superbly researched, it revealed much endeavour and insight. Commencing with a human biological analysis, the study moved on through bacterial invasion, detection and remedy. A major consideration was given to the study of the history of the Plague, and its huge and important changes...social, economic, climatic and cultural. Interesting research into *the Doomsday Book* and *the Feudal System* and its fall, provide just a flavour of content. *The Black Death*, the 2nd Global pandemic was also fully considered, as was the work of *The Pasteur Institute*. This presentation is a truly memorable contribution to Ringwood Philatelic Society's programme.

THE ROYAL PHILATELIC SOCIETY LONDON...

Foreign Bill and Telegraph Stamps.

Peter Cockburn FRPSL, President of the Royal Philatelic Society London, gave the presentation at the society's meeting held on 13 January. His subject was the 'Foreign Bill and Telegraph Stamps of Ceylon'. The presentation was complemented by a superb display of material, much of which is scarce unused because there was never a great demand from collectors, but equally rare to find used with often just a single example known.

There was a story to be told about most of the items shown. Such as the fact that Foreign Bills, the means by which payment for goods or services was assured, were often sent in twos or threes despatched overseas by different mails and ships, on the basis that at least one would be delivered. Consequently the Foreign Bill stamps were produced in strips of three, inscribed respectively 'Third of Exchange', 'Second of Exchange' and 'First of Exchange'.

Giving the Vote of Thanks, George James explained that much of the study into these stamps had only taken place in recent times, with Stanley Gibbons first adding these items to the catalogue in 2012, and much of the material only being offered for sale in 2019. He added that much of the complexity of the subject was caused by the 'beautiful unbridled chaos of the Stamp Revenue Office of Ceylon', often ordering vast quantities, such as having sufficient of one value to last 750 years, and resorting to much surcharging as a way of meeting needs as they arose, simultaneously using some surplus stock.

Simon Richards FRPSL, Vice President of the Society, presented Peter with a certificate and plaquette in recognition of his absorbing presentation.

TYPE 6 (A)

This is an entire to London with a good to fine Southampton / 80 mileage mark 54 x 12mm HA1275 (Recorded used from 1820) but THIS IS ONE YEAR EARLIER THAN RECORDED. On the reverse is a Christmas day arrival CDS in Red. This is recorded as in use from 1820 in Bryan Hunt's (Southampton & District Philatelic Society past Member) publication of March 1986 - Postmarks of Southampton 1700 - 1914 Postal Markings (Page 8).

MILFORD ON SEA STAMP CLUB.

20 February 2022 Meeting.

At our monthly meeting on 20 February, Chris Wheeler visited us again, this time displaying his two Open Class exhibition submissions from Autumn Stampex 2021. The first was "The History of The Salvation Army" which started with coverage of the social conditions in East London in the mid-1800s as found by William Booth on his arrival there from Nottingham, and by several other social reformers and commentators of the time such as Elizabeth Fry, Charles Dickens, Kier Hardie and William Willberforce. He traced the work of the Army as it became structured, its overseas missionary and social work, its uniform and music, and the assistance given to those in need during many Wars and Natural Disasters right up to the present day. The second topic, also using philatelic and open material was entitled "The Cause, Cure and History of the Plague Pandemics". Although prepared before the outbreak of the COVID epidemic, it still had a topical interest. Starting back in Bible times with Ten Plagues, the story covered the many devastating plagues and pandemics that afflicted the world. It covered the scientific detection, prevention and treatment of the Plague, and the effects it had on the development of medical research, the end of the feudal system, the mini ice age in Great Britain, which we are now bouncing back from, and the need for industrialisation in the wider farming industry.

Chris demonstrated that one of the underlining themes of these displays was that without huge expense, though with a lot of study and effort, members of local clubs can assemble sufficient material to reach an acceptable standard to present at a National Exhibition.

It seems to me that you are no longer have any interest in the wellbeing of H.P.H.S. so, it is time to stop "flogging the dead horse."


All paperwork etc, will be sent to our Chairman, Malcolm Lacey, after the "Hampshire Post" Journal which is almost completed.

PRESS RELEASE.

The Royal Philatelic Society London.

The complex question of colour

It started as an article for *The London Philatelist*, the journal of the Royal Philatelic Society London, and ended as a book *The Inks of De La Rue & Co. and their introduction of synthetic and aniline ingredients c.1850-1910*, also published by the Society.

The author of both was Peter Young FRPSL, a member of the Society for over 50 years, who on 7 April presented its Sir Daniel Cooper Lecture. Initiated in 2014, this series of lectures is in memory of the first President of the Society, Sir Daniel Cooper, holding the office from 1869 to 1878. The title of the 2020 lecture was 'De La

Rue and Colour c.1850-1910: an Introduction to Chromatic Philately'.

De La Rue had more than two hundred 'Copper Plate' inks in its *Recipe Book* for intaglio work that embraced banknotes, insignia on bonds, share certificates and stamps. During the lecture Peter paid tribute to the many who had helped during his research, not least Steve Jarvis FRPSL, who presented the Vote of Thanks. Steve explained that he had been scanning the indexes of De La Rue, held by the Society, when he received Peter's initial article. He believed the work needed to be not only encouraged but also expanded, for here was a 'very complex but important subject'.

Peter Cockburn FRPSL, expressing his own gratitude, presented Peter with a certificate and the Society's plaquette in recognition of the occasion.

Speaker Paul Leonard FRPSL.

Members of *Ringwood Philatelic Society* were greatly rewarded for stepping out on a cold February afternoon to hear Paul Leonard FRPSL not only address the fascinating subject of the exploration of forgeries in collections, but to also study at close hand a major associated exhibit. This was a display for the London 2022 International Stamp Exhibition entitled '*Forensic Philately*' being the work of *the Expert Committee of the RPSL*.

Paul traced a little of the history of 'The Royal' and then concentrated on details such as how Members of this Committee are employed and details of forensic philately, highlights and challenges and submitting established material. As Paul presented each Display sheet, he made a summary of its content, prior to audience Reference was made to Sperati and other notable examination. Victorian fraudsters. It became clear that the major thrust was to apply forensic principles to a world of mischief, misleading information and hard evidence to support or dismiss authenticity. Over time many stamps have been examined by the RPSL in great detail, including supposed rarities, including the 1 Cent Magenta!! A major input for consideration comes from 'the Trade' - dealers and auctioneers, but private collectors feature too, in pursuit of establishing truth...or otherwise!! Of course disappointments abound, especially when owners are convinced, with their cry of 'I have the only one!!'

Apart from Committee expertise, opinions and information come from numerous directions. These are often underpinned by the support of the latest technology such as perforation gauges, magnifiers, ultraviolet lamps, watermark detectors, indeed all things digital.

A major area of consideration surrounds the subject of '*shade*'. A vast fortune may be within grasp if a rare or unique shade is ascribed. This exciting RPSL display provided much insight into the workings of the Committee, its methods and reporting, together with interesting stories of success and intrigue!

Members enthralled by 'New Deal'.

'Entertaining and informative ... all have learnt something' was how Hugh Feldman FRPSL, giving the Vote of Thanks, described the presentation by Charles Epting to the members of the Royal Philatelic Society London on 21 April. The presentation titled 'Franklin Roosevelt's New Deal 1933-1942: A Philatelic Perspective' proved fascinating and enthralling as Charles unveiled the details of the 'New Deal', a series of relief agencies and public works programmes.

Established by President Franklin Delano Roosevelt between his inauguration in 1933 and America's entry into the Second World War in 1941, the 'New Deal' provided the necessary boost during the Great Depression, with many of the programmes still in effect today. Charles, who at 28 is President and CEO of stamp auctioneer H. R. Harmer, developed his interest in the initiative when, as a child, he visited national parks in America, where many of the facilities were constructed in the 1930s.

He embellished his presentation with a display of fine philatelic material, including the design and usage of the United States 3c stamp issued on 15 August 1933 to herald the National Recovery Administration, essentially a price-fixing scheme to set 'codes of fair competition'. Despite over one billion being printed, it remains one of America's most contentious stamps.

Presenting Charles with the Society's plaquette and certificate, Peter Cockburn FRPSL, President, added that he had been 'deeply impressed' by the presentation.
